

HAGSTROM TROPHY



The Hagstrom Trophy is an engraved pewter covered tankard on a turned walnut base. Named after General C.F. Hagstrom and won by the U.S. Rifle Team at the 1929 World Championship, Stockholm, Sweden. The trophy was first put in competition by NRA in 1979 for International type competition.

Match Conditions:

- 1979 Champion of the Woman's Standard Rifle Position event, a three day aggregate of 20 shots prone, standing and kneeling each day with the UIT standard rifle at the U.S. International Shooting Championships.
- 1980 Rededicated and awarded to the Indoor International Rifle Champion, course of fire 40 shots prone, 40 standing and 40 kneeling.
- 1981 Rededicated and awarded to the Junior Air Pistol Champion event, a three day aggregate of 40 shots a day, air pistol at the U.S. International Shooting Championships.
- 1993 Course of fire reduced to 60 shots.
- 1996 On loan to USA Shooting by mutual agreement. This trophy will be awarded for USAS selected events.
- 1998 Course of fire changed to a two day aggregate.
